ADOPTED REGULATION OF THE

BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINERS

A REGULATION relating to psychologists; clarifying certain requirements concerning the licensure by the Board of Psychological Examiners of a person who is engaged in the teaching of psychology or in psychological research; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law governing the practice of psychology specifies that a person is not prevented from engaging in the teaching of psychology or in psychological research without obtaining a license from the Board of Psychological Examiners if the teaching or research does not involve the delivery or supervision of direct psychological services to a person. (NRS 641.390) This regulation: (1) authorizes a person to teach psychology or conduct psychological research without a license if the teaching or research does not involve the delivery or supervision of direct psychological services to a person; and (2) requires a person who engages in the teaching of psychology or in psychological research that involves the delivery or supervision of direct psychological services to a person to obtain a license from the Board.

- **Section 1.** Chapter 641 of NAC is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a person who is engaged in the teaching of psychology or in psychological research is not required to obtain a license to practice as a psychologist pursuant to chapter 641 of NRS.
- 2. A person who is engaged in the teaching of psychology or in psychological research that involves the delivery or supervision of direct psychological services to a person must obtain a license to practice as a psychologist pursuant to chapter 641 of NRS.
